1. Size & Quantity

2. Allowed Items

Snacks/Drinks: Non-alcoholic beverages (≤24 oz per container) and sealed snacks.

3. Prohibited in Carry-Ons

Liquids >3.4 oz (e.g.Call+1(866)-228-3050 full-sized shampoo).

Sharp Objects: KnivesCall+1(866)-228-3050 scissors >4"Call+1(866)-228-3050 razors.

Sports Gear: Hockey sticksCall+1(866)-228-3050 baseball bats.

Tools: HammersCall+1(866)-228-3050 wrenches.

Firearms/Ammo: Strictly prohibited.

4. Terminal Tips

Security Screening: Expect X-ray scans and pat-downs.

Cabin Delivery: Carry-ons are brought directly to your room.

Avoid Overpacking: Cabins have limited storage. Prioriti

1. Sports Equipment

5. Other Special Items

Coolers: SmallCall+1(866)-228-3050 soft-sided coolers ($\leq 12" \times 12" \times 12"$) in carry-ons. Hard coolers may count as checked luggage.

Wedding Dresses: Garment bags count as 1 carry-on or checked item.

Pets: Only service animals (documented).

Critical Step: Contact Carnival's Accessibility Services (1-888-227-6482) at least 30 days pre-cruise for special requests.

Prohibited Items: What NOT to Pack

Fire Hazards

Pepper spray or tasers.

Health & Safety Risks

Perishable food (meatCall+1(866)-228-3050 dairyCall+1(866)-228-3050 fresh produce).

Chemicals (bleachCall+1(866)-228-3050 solvents).

Medical waste (needles without sharps containers).

Legal Restrictions

Illegal drugs (including marijuanaCall+1(866)-228-3050 even in states where legal).

Counterfeit goods.

Alcohol (Carnival sells duty-free drinks onboard; personal alcohol is restricted).

Exception: Wine/champagne (≤ 750 ml per person) may be brought onboard for a \$15 corkage fee.
